Preference will be given to candidates with expertise or experience in one or more of the following areas: 1) intimate partner violence, family law, family or relationship science; 2) advanced quantitative methods (e.g., randomized control trials, program evaluation) and analysis (e.g., multi-level modeling, longitudinal analysis, and structural equation modeling). The postdoctoral research associate will have opportunities for early career development, including publication and supervision by national leaders in the department of human development and family studies.

Candidates should have completed a doctoral degree in human development/family studies, psychology, or other relevant discipline. We seek applicants with strong methodological and quantitative data analysis skills, writing and communication skills, and the ability to manage a collaborative interdisciplinary team.
